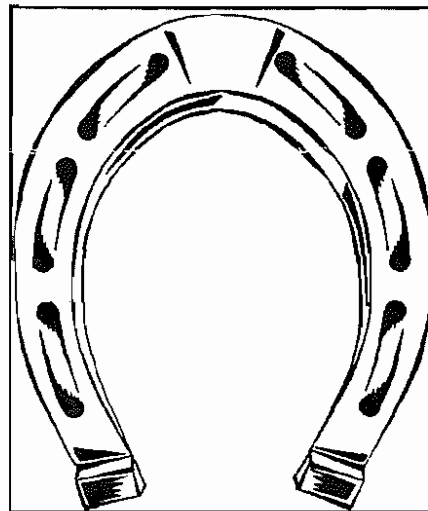

Josh Pichanick showed two 16.5 by 6 inch segmented Slave bowls which required 35 hours each to produce, and made available sketches and the formulas for anyone interested. He also showed a cheap but very effective lighting system which was attached to a boring bar for doing hollow or hollow form turning. The total cost was under \$10.00....

TURNERS TIDBITS

An inexpensive source for diamond hones is the House of Knives/// Things Engraved chain located in Limeridge Mall and Jackson Square in Hamilton: Maple View Mall in Burlington: and Seaway Mall in Welland.

Prices range from \$7.95 for fine course. Keep a small spray bottle of soapy water handy and the wet hone will put a super sharpe edge on all turning

tools, especially skews and scrapers. Often a quick hone will obviate the need for a grind,— and tools last longer.
