The Executive have decided to make the wearing of an approved face shield mandatory for all members who operate a lathe at Hands-on. We will request all demonstrators to wear a face shield or sign a waiver of liability.

We expect the two 14 " Maxi 25-114-M1 i General lathes, which are being purchased at a substantial reduction in costs, will be available for October's hands-on. General has provided at no cost a remote control kit for our main General lathe which we are awaiting delivery. With the Delta mini donated by Derek Dix and the one that we purchased we will now have four smaller variable speed lathes as well as the main General.

We will be holding raffles in the next few months of demonstrator pieces donated by Cindy Drozda and Frank DiTomaso. Cindy's box and demo finial pieces were raffled in September and her star box will be raffled in October at the main meeting.

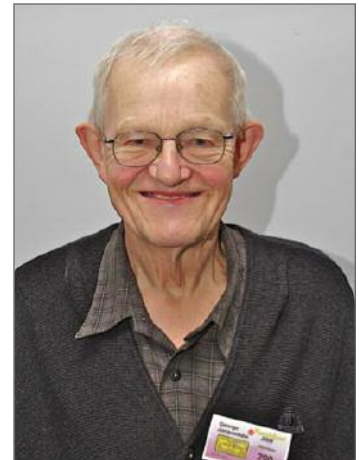

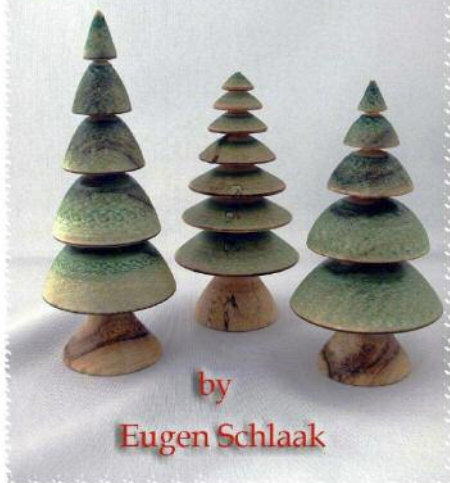

 - Any other duties that may be done are voluntary and depend on the skills and desires of the incumbent.

Reader's showcase

Peter Hyde moved to Canada from London in the 1970s, he shows us around his spacious Ontario workshop

I've been a joiner and cabinet maker since undertaking an apprenticeship in the 1950s. After moving to Canada in the mid 1970s I got into old house renovations, and on one of those jobs was asked to turn about 400 posts and spindles. I had never used a lathe but kept that quiet, and the deal was the customer bought the lathe and chisels which were to be mine afterwards.

11 years ago the big maple (*Acer saccharum*) in my neighbour's yard was taken down and cut up for firewood. The wood looked very interesting and I dragged out the forgotten lathe and chisels and turned my first bowl. That was the beginning of the addiction.

As friends and relatives became inundated with products of my new passion: I had to look for other outlets or have big bonfires. I started supplying two retail stores with turnings. That's now down to one. The proceeds from sales have just about covered my costs for new tools and a better lathe.

I don't like repetition and try to explore new things as much as possible. Slowly I'm getting to be known as a source for bowls and other unusual things that make ideal special gifts. This allows me to charge what I want for a piece and not have a retailer's mark up make an item too expensive.

I am a member of the Golden Horseshoe Woodturners Guild in Burlington, Ontario and enjoy mixing with other members and talking turning.
