Demonstration Report:
Paul Newton, Lidded boxes
October 19th, 2017

Paul Newton is the President of the London and new Kitchener Woodturners Guilds. This means that as well as leading the established group at the Thames Valley woodturners guild, he is also busy in starting and establishing the new Guild for Kitchener Waterloo.

Paul gave us an introduction into box design and showed some samples of the boxes he has turned. He then proceeded to turn a lidded box. After rounding his blank, he parted off the lid section from the base. The lid was turned first and then the base was chucked and turned. The top of the base was carefully reduced to fit inside the mortise of the lid so that a “pop” fit was achieved.



He demonstrated techniques that were efficient in hollowing out the base, including the drilling out of excess material before hollowing to size with bowl gouges.

The base and lid were then brought together and turned as one piece for final shaping.

All in all, a very informative and detailed demonstration that should have enabled anyone to go and attempt turning a box themselves.
