His focus was on his perfected spindle-turning techniques which virtually eliminate the need for sanding.

From a rough branch to a surface as smooth as a baby's nub! WOW.

A really masterful gesture was his invitation to anyone to come up and have a try. Congratulations to the three members who volunteered, you did real well.

HOLES IN ONE

Following the coffee break (which raised \$35-00) Doug Newlove did a SHOW and TELL of his thin wall Manitoba Maple vases featuring delicate floral patterns around the

entire circumference. He pierces these with an air-operated dentist's drill, rotating at about 200,000 rpm. A Dremmel is not nearly fast enough.

Doug, who is also a member of the W.G.O., was inspired by a recent club seminar given by the acclaimed turner from Saskatchewan, Mr. Frank Sudol.

Doug has "offered"! to do a full demo for us, probably in September.

HOLLYWOOD, EAT OUR DUST

Our thanks again to the first two demonstrators, and as good as they undoubtedly are, what really transformed the presentation into an Oscar-style epic was Al McBurney's live video taping on a colour monitor, for ALL to see.

In addition, we have Eugen Schlaak to thank for providing a borrowed audio system, which made the speakers' voices clearly audible, even over the old Wadkin doing some 1600 r.p.m.

What you may not have been able to see on the monitor (and Al did not miss much) the overhead mirror showed in clear detail.

And that wasn't all either. We sincerely thank Len Collins for filming the entire evening's proceedings, which will later be available through our library.

DISCOMANIA

Our third presentation was by Eugen Schlaak who did not miss a grit in showing us how to economise on conventional power sanding pads and discs, by making his own.

They are much cheaper, longer lasting, less prone to leaving scratch lines, or spinning off.

The trick is knowing what is available from industrial and autobody suppliers and who they are.

Eugen's twenty years of research and turning experience was very evident, and to assist us all he provided **Source of Supply lists** which were quickly snapped up by those who were fast enough @ a buck apiece, which he kindly donated to the G.H.W.G.

SHOW and TELL

Cliff Rose showed us some lovely pieces he had turned from a piece of Mulberry, won at last month's WOOD RAFFLE

Josh Pichanick explained how the grain in inexpensive plain wood such as Tree of Heaven or Ash can be dramatically highlighted by applying high pigment, non-toxic Japan Paint (from Lee Valley).

After sanding very well, spray at least once with Sanding Sealer and buff to a shine. (cont'd)

SHOW and TELL (cont'd)

Mix a little paint with turpentine, wipe on and off again almost immediately, then finish with fine sandpaper and 0000 steel wool. With only the grain highlighted, apply Waterlox (of course) and watch the startling transformation.

Our President has been trying to arrange a live demo and product display at this show, and had a brief phone conversation with the organiser.

However, since then, all calls and messages left for them have been ignored.

Whatever the reason, a majority of the Executive agreed this lack of response was unacceptable and therefore the GHWG will not participate in the show.
