OLD TREES NEVER DIE, THEY JUST FADE INTO BOWLS. from Josh Pichanick.

Our own Dr. Ken McCauig called me recently to say that a neighbour of his, had given him pieces of English Walnut and remembering that it was one of my favourate woods asked him to call me as well.

Mr. Don May, who is a noted turner and, I believe, also on the Burlington City Council, did call, with details of the tree's owner, who is Alderman Joan Loughheed, of Burlington. After calling her, Kevin Ellis (with his 3000 lb. capacity trailer), and I went over to see what was left over, and to our great delight, found that the tree had been about three feet in diameter and there were many very large pieces still available.

We introduced ourselves as members of the GHWG, and explained that apart from a few pieces for ourselves, we would donate some to the Guild's monthly wood raffle.

Kevin Ellis further suggested that we could also consider selling the balance to our members via the newsletter, at very nominal prices, with the net proceeds going to the Guild

Aldeman Loughheed was so happy the wood was to be gainfully use, she offered us all we wanted.

A few years ago Alderman Loughheed, as a VON, had cared for a Mr. Blair whose family had owned the house for about one hundred years and lived to the age of 105. She never dreamed her family would one day actally buy the property.

The house is apparently one of the oldest in Burlington and the tree, which was probably planted from an imported seedling, is thought to be one hundred years old or more. Apart from large diseased limbs overhanging the house, some of

the rotted out lim. were home to a number of very possessive and quite vicious squirels. It seems that any time anyone tried to sit in the backyard, nuts etc would rain down, and not by accident.

They were actually thrown by the squirels, who had developed quite an accurate aim.

As a token of our appreciation, I gave Alderman Loughheed a Tree-Of-Heaven platter I had turned and agreed to invite her to a Show and Tell, probably in the Fall, to see what our members have crafted from that lovely old tree.

With somewhat flattened tires on his very full trailer, Kevin Ellis took the pieces home where he will chainsaw them into various size

My thanks to Kevin for his willing help, especially as he had to load those huge pieces onto the trailer all by himself.
